# Background

- 10 February 2002 Switzerland ratified Rotterdam Convention.
- 24 February 2004 Entry into force of Convention.
- 1. January 2005 Entry into force of PIC-Ordinance: implements the Rotterdam Convention.
- 1. January 2021 Entry into force of severe restriction of export of certain banned phytosanitary products.




### Obligations of exporters: Notification of exports



### **Duties of Swiss DNA:**

- DNA prepares and sends export notification to importing Party DNA.
- DNA sends identification number to customs administration and to exporter to be mentioned in export declaration.
- DNA checks export statistics received from customs administration.
- DNA Acknowledges receipt of export notification from exporting Parties.
- Public information: Information on received and sent export notifications published on FOEN website.


### Collaboration with customs administration

- DNA informs customs administration on the identification numbers issued.
- Customs officer can stop an export of a chemical covered by the Convention if the declaration doesn't carry the identification number.
- Customs administration send on a regular base export statistics on specific tariff numbers.
- FOEN and customs administration collaborate to develop and update the work procedure of the customs officers regarding the enforcement of the Rotterdam Convention at the border.

## **Import decisions**

- FOEN in consultation with concerned offices takes import decision.
- Importers have to comply with the import decisions (Article 7, PIC Ordinance).

### Update of chemicals subject to export notification obligation

FOEN in consultation with concerned offices and after a public hearing decides about the chemicals that are made subject to the export notification procedure.

- Banned or severely restricted industrial chemicals.
- Industrial chemicals that are subject to authorization obligation for which no uses or only a few essential uses are authorized.
- Active ingredients of phytosanitary products that have been excluded from the list of authorized active ingredients.
- Active ingredients of biocide products that have been excluded from the list of authorized active ingredients.
- Purpose of regulations is protection of human health and environment.




### Notification of final regulatory action, listing of chemicals

- Bans, restrictions and authorizations of chemicals in Switzerland are widely harmonized with those in the European Union.
- Bans, restrictions and authorisation are often related to EU risk assessments.
- → Notification of final regulatory action are composed of bridging information and locally generated data.
- Prerequisite for listing of chemicals in Annex III is at least two NFRAs from at least two PIC regions fulfilling listing criteria (Switzerland and EU are in the same PIC region).



### The effectiveness of the Rotterdam Convention is not optimal





Risk evaluation ≠ Risk assessment

All chemicals considered by the COPs fulfil listing criteria!

### Export of certain phytosanitary product is severely restricted

Since 1 January 2021 new regulation for export of certain pesticides is in force (Annex 2.5, Chemicals Risk Reduction Ordinance):

- Export of a few specific phytosanitary active ingredients and their products are banned.
- Export of certain phytosanitary active ingredients and their products require an export licence.
- Export licence is only delivered if explicit consent from importing country (also non-Parties) has been granted.
- If explicit consent request remains unanswered: no possibility to waive export licence requirement.
