











## Side-event launching the Publication: "Synergies Success Stories"

Over the past years, the Parties to the Basel, Rotterdam and Stockholm conventions have set up a unique process that enhances collaboration and coordination among the conventions. The decisions taken by the conferences of the Parties provide general directions on how to implement synergies at the national level. In practice, there are several ways of achieving this, which will be a major challenge for Parties over the coming years.

In order to provide inspiration to Parties, the "synergies success stories" publication has been developed by the Secretariats of the Basel, Rotterdam and Stockholm conventions and the Division for Sustainable Development of UNDESA. It contains experience from stakeholders directly involved in implementing synergies at the national level on national coordination mechanisms, information management systems, regional cooperation and capacity building activities.
