Note from the Secretariat

1. The Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee, at its seventh session in Geneva, confirmed the nomination of the 29 experts to serve on the Interim Chemical Review Committee. The following confirmed experts are new compared to those that served on the Committee, at its first session:
